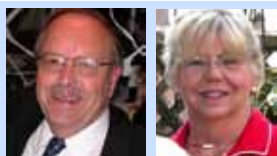

## 1884 De Dion Runabout Sells for \$4.62 Million at RM Auction



One of the world's oldest running motor cars up for auction in Hershey, Pa. the 1884 De Dion Bouton Et Trepardoux Dos-A-Dos Steam Runabout, sold on Oct. 7 for more than double its estimated price--a cool \$4.62 million. That includes a 10 percent buyer's premium.

The 127 year-old vehicle drew a standing ovation from the crowd, according to RM Auctions, which presided over the sale. Bidding started at \$500,000 before immediately jumping to \$1 million, which brought another round of applause.

The final price represents a new world record for an early motor car sold at auction, according to RM.

# Presidents Words

Greetings,

A third term, does it make sense? Before you decide read the Nominating Committee's Report; then, come back here. (**Reports are on page #7**)

In our first attempt to find a suitable candidate for president, we went through the 2011 Roster and identified individuals who regularly attend Club meetings. Then we subtracted out individuals who had expressed no interest in other positions, people who are already deeply involved in the Club such as Pete Lowman and Guy Generaux, and people who had a long commute into the Seattle Area. We came up with a number of good prospects, but none were interested in the position.

Understanding that this result wasn't entirely unexpected and likely will be an ongoing difficulty we asked what can we do to make the job more attractive. Other clubs split the job with one person serving 6 months and a second person the other 6 months. Another approach would be to have a two year commitment—one year in training the other serving as president. We elected the option of splitting off some of the president's traditional responsibilities.

Todd ventured the comment that it seemed as if a large part of the Directors "job" was to come to meetings and eat! Having served as a Director, I think there is some truth to that statement. Having an active group of Directors, individuals willing to put together a tour/garage tour, etc. will make everyone's job easier.

The final piece of this picture is the 2012 Slate of candidates. There are at least two who could step up and serve as President in 2013.

At the last Board Meeting Scott Jenkins asked how much time I spent on Club business. An excellent question, but hard to answer since I don't "type" nor am I really computer literate. Someone who is would spend considerably less time than I do. But, that question needs to be answered. We need to measure the impact of a more active group of Directors and the effect of spinning off some of the president's traditional duties. The Board needs to evaluate this process, recommend changes and even recommend changes to the By-laws. Otherwise Mark Keenholts will find himself in the same dilemma a year from now!

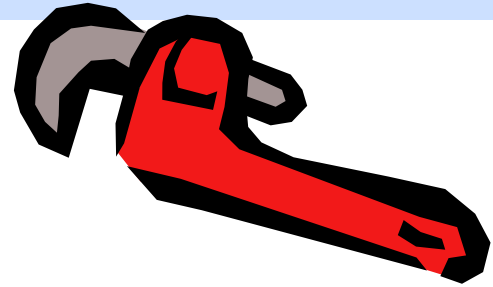
